Friends at PLSO, KAPS, ISPLS:

First I want to thank everyone for the great turnout at the March 18, 2008 meeting at Cincinnati State. It was great to hear Mr. DeNu address the crowd - to feel the excitement that he generated and to feel the energy that the crowd gave back was very heartwarming.

Now, let's put that energy to work ! ---- I would like to list the four proposals or motions that were talked about so that you can take them back to your chapter meetings for conversation, debate and voting.

1. Advisory Committee: This committee would be made up of the three current members of the Cincinnati State Engineering Technologies Academic Advisory Committee ( Steve Cahill, Bud Payne and Dave Cox ) joined together with 1 to 2 members of each of the local chapters. This committee would report to each chapter monthly ( a monthly spot on the agenda would be great ). This committee would meet periodically to discuss survey program curriculum as well as other scholastic matters. I will volunteer to chair this committee if needed.
2. Professional Mentors: This would include a group of members that would be willing to pitch in to help at various school functions such as a) high school visits b) career days to promote our profession c) Trig Star d) guest lecturing e) job shadowing f) participation in the Student Chapter of ASCE at Cin State.
3. Scholarship Committees: Some brainstorming needed here - I could foresee one committee or four individual committees but each chapter would have delegates - ideally each chapter could have one scholarship per year for a Cincinnati State student - OK - 2 per year if you all insist. It seems to me that four individual committees with one common goal would be great - fundraising for this endeavor could be shared.
4. This is more in the hands of Cincinnati State but our input is of utmost importance - continuing education / lecturing at our seminars / on line PDH's or CPU'S. Maybe a collaboration between Cin State and us to create better and more useful continuing education. I do understand that this could stir up some controversy but dialogue is essential to our renewed relationship. The group formed in item one could handle the communication with Cin State.

Each chapter should discuss these items in depth and formulate a detailed report to share with all - I can be the lightning rod for ideas if need be.
